The above is a very good portrait of Mrs. Harriet Hayden (recently deceased), the wife of the well-known Bostonian, Lewis Hayden, who died about a year ago. If memory serves us correctly, Mr. and Mrs. Hayden were materially assisted to freedom during slavery days by the venerable Rev. Calvin Fairbank (white), now a resident of Angelica, N. Y. It was Mrs. Hayden who left by will \$5,000 to Harvard College, to be used in assisting deserving Afro-American students of that famous and leading institution. She was a favorite with the young ladies of Boston and had an exceptionally large circle of friends and acquaintances.
